PRAYER AND FASTING

"And when you pray, do not do like the hypocrites, for they love to pray standing in the synagogues and on the street corners to be seen by others. Truly I tell you, they have received their reward in full. But when you pray, go into your room, close the door and pray to your Father, who is unseen. Then your Father, who sees what is done in secret, will reward you". Matthew 6:5-6

"When you fast, do not look somber as the hypocrites do, for they disfigure their faces to show others they are fasting. Truly I tell you they have received their reward in full. But when you fast, put oil on your head and wash your face, so it will not be obvious to others that you are fasting, but only to your Father, who in unseen; and your Father, who sees what is done in secret, will reward you." Matthew 6:16-18

Love that Endures

Love that is Unconditional

Agape is by far the most special, most respectful of all the Greek types of love. It is a universal, unconditional, selfless love for others. It is the kind Jesus refers to again and again throughout His ministry.

Jesus perfectly exemplified agape love when He died on the cross to save us from sin and death. He suffered so we could be set free. Jesus repeatedly taught His disciples and thousands of others about agape love and openly displayed it everywhere He went. From the Sermon on the Mount to countless healings, from raising Lazarus from the dead to dying for us all on the cross, Jesus was the perfect embodiment of agape love. Jesus is the finest example of love we have, and it is the one we should strive to copy every day.

To give agape love is to be like our Lord Jesus Christ. Make it a daily goal to put others first and to love them generously. God will bless you for it in unbelievable ways.





Father God, help us to follow the examples You taught about unconditional love. This world needs more kindness and less criticism. Keep our eyes focused on You as we strive to live a life worthy of Your sacrifice. In Jesus' name, Amen.



TUESDAY, OCTOBER 18, 2022



"This is My commandment, that you love one another as I have loved you. Greater love has no one than this, that someone lay down his life for his friends." - John 15:12-13

Love that is Sacrificial

The phrase "love of Christ," as opposed to "love for Christ," refers to His love toward humankind. His love is His willingness to act in our best interest, especially in meeting our greatest need, even though it cost Him everything and even though we were the least worthy of such love.

Sacrificial love is giving EVERYTHING and is a rare type of agape love reserved for few humans. Jesus is the perfect example, but we see others...the kind of love shown by police officers and firefighters who run INTO danger to save complete strangers.

It is the type of love that makes a man save a drowning child with no thought of self; the kind of love that members of our armed forces possess that makes them sacrifice their lives for others they do not know. We can understand people who willingly give their lives for those they deem worthy – a friend, a relative, other "good" people – but Christ's love extends to those most unworthy of it and is God-like love, not man-like love.

We need to honor this type of love by trusting Him as our Savior; He makes us God's children, co-heirs with Him!





Father God, this is a tall order - to love sacrificially in a sin-filled world. We know the heart of the evil one is to kill, steal and destroy. You call us to be Your ambassadors, to represent You, as we seek to do Your will. Fill us with Holy Spirit so that our prayers and desires would be of our Heavenly Father for all to repent, believe in the Gospel, and be saved. In Jesus' name, Amen.

I can do all things through Him who strengthens me. - Philippians 4:13

Love One's Self

When thinking of self-love, initially, we may think of 2 Timothy 3:2-5. This type of self-love does not seek freedom from negative thoughts about oneself, whether guilt, insecurity, or even awkwardness. Rather, it promises that if you look inward and can find a way to love what you see, you will find peace. Not true!

On the other hand, righteousness, not vanity, seeks to see ourselves as God sees us: "Sinful, guilty, inadequate humans who have been washed clean and declared righteous by faith in Jesus Christ." (Roman's 3:24)

Learning to love ourselves is a process, flaws included. Flaws are a part of who we are and how we mature in Christ. Only when we can love ourselves and who He created us to be can we love one another as Christ loves us.

Roy Kiser shares his experience, "My support group often prayed for us when I was without a full-time job for four years. Some unknown person sent my family a large check each month for the first year while we got on our feet. Another family allowed us to live in the basement of their home. Each of these people shared what resources they had with us."

How has the Lord blessed you? How does the Lord want you to show His love for others? It could be anything from a financial gift to a word of encouragement or prayer over the phone. The possibilities and needs are unlimited.

Separating from the World and Making Good it's Choice

During Jesus' final night on earth as a human, He expressed deep concern for the future welfare of His followers. He even prayed about the matter to His Father. Clearly, it was of great importance to Jesus that His followers stay separated from the world.

The "world" Jesus refers to was all humankind alienated from God, ruled by Satan, and enslaved to the selfish, prideful spirit that comes from Satan. God did not create us to live in a sin-filled world, but because sin came into the world, He wants us to live like Christians and be a light for Christ.

He wants us to live daily in the world, surrounded by sin and temptation, and rise above it all. We should befriend the sinner without partaking in sin. We are to be light to the world without allowing the world to diminish our light. Christians have always struggled with how to understand this call. We are set apart because we pray for our enemies, remain humble, and above all, do not fear because we know that nothing, not even death, can separate us from the love of God (Romans 8:35-39).





Father God, forgive us for the way we, as a body, have turned from You and adopted false teaching and thinking. We have not always lived as "lights in the darkness" the way Jesus taught us. He considered that God was able even to raise him from the dead, from which, figuratively speaking, he did receive him back. - Hebrews 11:17-19

Stepping Out and Going Foward on the Word of God

In the 1989 film "The Last Crusade," there is an iconic scene known as "the leap of faith" where Indiana Jones has to literally step out into the air and have faith that he won't fall. As soon as he takes his first step, an invisible bridge is there to support him! That is such a tangible example of what it looks like to step out in faith on the Word of God.

It's not enough to just believe God will be there for us; we must ACT in faith and take the next step. When God told Abraham (Genesis 17:5) that He would make him the Father of many nations, Abraham believed Him.

How do we know? Fast forward to Genesis 22:5 where Abraham tells his servants to "Stay here with the donkey; I and the boy will go over there and worship and come again to you." THAT is faith in action. How will you act out your faith in God's word? In what way is God calling you to step out in faith knowing that God will do what He said He would do?

Appropriating the Blood of Christ

We can have faith in God today, knowing Christ suffered and bled for us. By His blood, He forgives our sins. We know that God used blood many times to lead His people. Faith that Lifts the Worst Sinner into the Highest Place of God's Blessing

Have you ever heard someone say, "there are people on this earth that don't deserve to be here." God's Word tells us that God is love and does not want any soul to perish.

It reminds us of the mercy of God for the worst sinner and helps us blend the work of salvation with the higher work of sanctification. A great example of this is the story of Rahab in the book of Joshua. It was not by chance that those spies found their way to Rahab's house.

God had plans for this pagan prostitute in a city about to be utterly destroyed because of sin. Her faith and obedience led to her ability to change her ways and encourage countless generations through the genealogy of Jesus Christ (Matthew 1:5).





Father, thank you for the lessons I can learn from the life of Rahab. I pray by faith I will carry out Your good and perfect will with courage through the power of the Holy Spirit. As I face difficulties, may I always seek You first for direction and guidance, no matter how things around me look. In Jesus' name, Amen.



SATURDAY, OCTOBER 29, 2022



Not that I have already obtained this or am already perfect, but I press on to make it my own, because Christ Jesus has made me His own. Brothers, I do not consider that I have made it my own. But one thing I do: forgetting what lies behind and straining forward to what lies ahead, I press on toward the goal for the prize of the upward call of God in Christ Jesus. Let those of us who are mature think this way, and if in anything you think otherwise, God will reveal that also to you. - Philippians 3:12-15

Overcoming and Entering into the Full Inheritance of Promise

"By faith, the walls of Jericho fell down" (Hebrews 11:30). The wilderness is passed, the land of promise is before them, and the realization of their greatest hopes is about to begin. The inheritance of faith is awaiting.

There's always some barrier lying across our path when God has some new and glorious experience for us. Maybe we think it's too hard, something totally out of our comfort zone, some last-minute conflict, some towering Jericho.

It is then, like Jacob, that we must get alone with God. We must acknowledge trial is not punishment and know if we lean in through times of hardship, we will receive blessing and life-long victory. It is God's opportunity for spiritual triumph. Believe that it is possible, that it is for you. Then take the place of faith, stand fast, and press on.





May the God of our Lord Jesus Christ, the glorious Father, give me the Spirit of wisdom and revelation so that I may know Him better. Enlighten the eyes of my heart so I may know the hope to which He has called me, the riches of His glorious inheritance in the saints, and His incomparably great power for us who believe. But I say to you, Love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you, so that you may be sons of your Father who is in heaven. Hope Resists Resentment

We often harbor grudges or resentment toward those we feel have wronged us through words or actions.

The Bible teaches us to resist resentment and retaliation.

We are to show love to our enemies and not try to get even with them. God does the judging. It is not our task.

Leave the evil doers to God's judgment.





Lord, today I pray for peace and forgiveness in my heart. I no longer want the words or actions of others to direct my life. I pray for and forgive those who have done me wrong. Reveal yourself to them, Lord, so they can receive the same peace I have in You. I will resist any further resentment and look to You for hope. In Jesus' name, Amen.



MONDAY, OCTOBER 31, 2022



But for You, O Lord, do I wait; it is You, O Lord my God, who will answer. - Psalm 38:15

Hope Expects God to Answer

How do you develop the hope that expects God to answer? This kind of bold hope is developed over time through intentional personal Bible study that builds and strengthens our convictions about who God is (Ps 18:2-3), what His plan is for us (Jer 29:11-13), and God being our personal God (Isaiah 43:1). When you combine this with unrelenting prayer (Luke 18:1), God will answer.

Do you believe that God cares enough about you to give you an answer? Sometimes God says yes, sometimes He says no, but the most difficult answer is "wait." When God says to wait, we must fight to believe that He does care and He will move when He believes the time is right. (1 Cor 10:13).

TUESDAY, NOVEMBER 1, 2022



And there was a woman who had had a discharge of blood for twelve years, and who had suffered much under many physicians, and had spent all that she had, and was no better but rather grew worse. She had heard the reports about Jesus and came up behind him in the crowd and touched his garment. For she said, "If I touch even his garments, I will be made well." And immediately the flow of blood dried up, and she felt in her body that she was healed of her disease. - Mark 5:25-29

Hope Doesn't Stop Believing

The bleeding woman deeply believed that physical contact with Jesus would heal her. Her decision to have faith in Jesus got His attention in a crowded group while He was on His way to healing someone else. In her pain, the bleeding woman still chose to seek Jesus.

Do you turn away from God or seek Him out when believing gets hard?

When the pain clouds our judgment and tells us it's easier to stop believing, we must choose to obey scriptures like 2 Corinthians 5:7, "We walk by faith, not by sight." This verse exudes hope. It gives us the courage to keep hoping when we want to quit.

What scripture can you memorize and carry in your heart to help you continue to believe?

Hope is Louder than a Crowd

"Who do you say I am?" (Luke 9:20). Jesus' question is louder than the crowd. Interestingly, Jesus' first question was, "who do the crowds say I am?" (Luke 9:18).

Who are the crowds in our lives? Could it be our doubt, resistance, pain, or the majority's conclusions? Any voice that calls us away from being in step with God is a distraction and keeps us from living in the hope that He promised. Our hope is in Jesus Christ, and how we walk out that hope answers who we say He is. How are we walking out that hope?





Meditate on Romans 5:1-6



FRIDAY, NOVEMBER 4, 2022



For in this hope we were saved. Now hope that is seen is not hope. For who hopes for what he sees? 25 But if we hope for what we do not see, we wait for it with patience. - Romans 8:24-25

Hope Hears God

As a child of God, we know that we should hope in the Lord, but if we're honest, sometimes that's hard. We are fallen beings and need the hope of salvation. We need the hope of a life other than the sometimes painful one in which we live.

God's Word is the story of man from beginning to end, and hope runs throughout. God told Abraham to leave his father's land, and he did. He said through Abraham will come a great nation, and it did. God spoke to Joseph through dreams. He endured hardships, but Joseph believed, and everything God showed him came to pass. At the age of 80, Moses sent the plagues upon Egypt, proving the one true God and delivering Israel's children. When Jesse lined up seven of his sons for Samuel to choose a King, David (who became known as a man after God's own heart) was absent and not considered.

Let's remember that if we ever think that we're insignificant. In our hope, we hear God. Our hope is because of Jesus Christ and his love for us!





Father, thank you for the gift of Your son that allows me to come before You. Thank you for the encouragement all throughout your Word that clearly tells me where I am to put my hope. My hope lies in You and You alone. Remind me of Jeremiah 29:11-13 if my hope fades. It is You who knows the plans for me. I will call upon You and come and pray. You have declared that you will listen if I seek you with all of my heart. Please help me to be thankful for the times that draw me closer to You. In Jesus' name, Amen.

And hope does not put us to shame, because God's love has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit who has been given to us. - Romans 5:5

Hope Believes Anyway

In the Christian life, there are many things we must walk out in faith. Often, we use the word - hope - meaning I wish or maybe it might happen. In the above verse, it is in terms of being confident with no doubts about our eternal future. We don't know the future in this life.

Roy Kiser reflects, "When the Lord asked me to quit my job without a job in the future, it was like leaping off a cliff, not knowing where I would land. It took four years of waiting and learning before the Lord revealed the job I have now."

The one thing we can be confident about as believers is Christ's presence now and our eternal future with Him. Paul said in 2 Corinthian 5:8 that if we are "away from the body, we are at home with the Lord."
